PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE JUNE 2015

OUR SANCTUARY

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our mutual obligation as Orthodox Christians is to give honor and respect to God in His house by preserving, refurbishing and maintaining the Holy instruments, vessels and structure of the sanctuary.

To that end, your Parish Council has, starting this past January, conducted a top to bottom inspection of our church to determine what is needed to keep God's House in good repair. The results revealed a shocking number of projects that ranged from desirable to critical.

In order to finance these repairs, the community wisely voted to sell the donated East Brunswick home, of the late Maria Denopoulos. In June we successfully sold the property and divided the proceeds placing \$200,000.00 into a restructured endowment fund for future maintenance and beatification of the church. The remaining balance will go toward immediate necessary repairs. As you look around the church you will start to see many changes for the better, such as:

- 1- (repair fund)- Side entrance Completely redone
- 2- (donated) Provide pew kneelers with new rubber stops preventing scratches on the terrazzo floor and lessening the sound
- 3- (donated) Terrazzo floors have been scrubbed from a stained black and restored to the original luster white.
- 4- (donated) paraffin white candles gave off soot and smoke staining painted surfaces and have been replaced by bees wax, made by the nuns of Agia Skepi monastery.
- 5- (donated) All candle Holders (red glass) by Iconastasis have been repaired or replaced. (please do not put glass candles on marble below the Iconastasis the marble has been newly cleaned and candles should go in glass holders.
- 6- (donated)- New Sound System
- 7- (donated) Newly refurbished lights through our narthex, nave and sanctuary have been installed. Our beautiful original light fixtures have been restored, rewired and refurbished with led efficient lights.
- 8- (repair fund) Roof leaking in church now under repair.
- 9- (repair fund) Restoring walls, doors, wood and tile in basement from the flood on May 31

TO BE DONE

- 10- Air condition unit platform repair
- 11- Replace church kitchen
- 12- Stain glass windows
- 13- Paint and repair water leaks damage.
- 14- Landscaping

So many of you have been so generous in giving to help us restore our church. In subsequent newsletters we will itemize particular purchases that need to be made and ask if any donations may be obtained before we resort to using monies from the repair fund.

So as you see these changes occur take pleasure that we do so to Honor and please our God. Thank you to all donors who will be formally acknowledged on St. Demetrios Day and at our church dance on November 14, 2015. Remember our church and keep it Holy.

St. Demetrios Listserv Policy

Listserv policy was discussed at the April Parish Council meeting. Dino Kusulas was appointed chair the Communications Committee and tasked draft policy which was subsequently approved by the president.

St Demetrios listserv policy, with the exception of breaking news and time sensitive events (i.e. deaths announcements; information for trisagion services and funeral arrangements), is to consolidate as much information as possible into a single weekly listserv posting – typically to accompany the Friday posting of the weekly bulletin.

With the exception of the weekly and monthly newsletters to the community the listserv will not be used to distribute multiple large-sized file attachments such as fliers and documents from outside of our organization. We will however encourage providing, and will publish, links to such documents within the St. Demetrios Listserv postings.

Meeting notices for distribution to the entire community via listserv are acceptable and should only serve as a supplement to each organization's own membership focused email campaign, telephone chain, mailings or monthly newsletter notices.

All organizations will be asked to plan accordingly for promotion of events through the listserv.

Submissions for the weekly listery posting must be submitted to the Parish Council for review and approval in time for the next scheduled Parish Council meeting. The submissions must:

- Include a summary of the following month's planned submissions.
- Include a final draft of each planned submission.
 - Include URLs (links) from where subscribers can download documents, forms, fliers or additional information
 must be included in the intended copy or a point of contact email address from which subscribers can request
 materials to be forwarded.
- Include the schedule of distribution i.e. a date for each planned posting must be specified.

In addition, each organization will appoint a duly elected officer, i.e. Secretary or VP, to coordinate the above submission/process with the Parish Council. The church email address Stdgoa@gmail.com shall be primary point of contact (POC) for all listserv planning.

Regarding the monthly newsletter, all organizations are encouraged to provide a monthly submission to highlight, promote and celebrate each organization, it's mission and it's membership. A duly appointed officer of the organization, or designate, should be coordinating newsletter submissions as well with the POC referenced in the last published edition of the newsletter. All submissions must meet the specified deadline criteria as per the last published newsletter.
