

He lived in the world, but was not, as the Saviour says, of the world. He trod on the earth yet conducted himself like citizen of heaven. St Nectarios surrendered his spirit to the Lord on November 9, 1920 at the age of seventy-four.

November in America is the month of Thanksgiving. We as Orthodox Christians are ready to thank God for all of the blessings that we receive, not only in November, but throughout the year.

St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Philippians, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, Rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). But why are we thankful? Are we thankful for material possessions or for anything material or physical? These are good things, but they are unstable. Health can turn to sickness and the rich can become poor. But one thing is constant: the love of God.

When St. Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice, he writes to them in the midst of great suffering, both for himself and for them. He is in jail, and they are being persecuted for their faith. Why would they rejoice? Paul urges them to rejoice in the surpassing glory of knowing Jesus Christ. If we seek Him and His Kingdom, we will have enough physical and material comfort. But we will also have a security and a comfort beyond anything this world can offer.

We must first seek him and we must rejoice in knowing Him. And then we will be thankful for a true gift, not a passing gift that is unstable and unsure, but the love of God which is more precious than any earthly treasure, more glorious than any earthly fame and more beautiful than any earthly beauty.

Rejoice in the Lord. Again I say, Rejoice!

Ο Νοέμβριος στην Αμερική είναι ένας μήνας της ευχαριστίας. Ο Απόστολος Παύλος μας λέει στην επιστολή του προς τους Φιλιππησίους, «Χαίρετε έν Κυρίω πάντοτε πάλιν έρῶ, γαίρετε! "(Φιλιππησίους 4: 4). Αλλά, γιατί να είμαστε ευγνώμονες; Είμαστε ευγνώμονες για τα αγαθά ή για κάτι σωματικό; Αυτά είναι καλά πράγματα, αλλά είναι ασταθή. Η υγεία μπορεί να γίνει την ασθένεια και ο πλούσιος μπορεί να γίνει τον φτωχό. Αλλά ένα πράγμα είναι σταθερό: η αγάπη του Θεού. Όταν ο Απόστολος Παύλος λέει στους Φιλιππησίους να χαίρονται, τους γράφει εν μέσω της μεγάλης ταλαιπωρίας, τόσο για τον εαυτό του και γι 'αυτούς. Ο Απόστολος Παύλος είναι στη φυλακή, και οι Φιλιππησίοι διώκονται για την πίστη τους. Γιατί να γαίρονται; Ο Παύλος τους προτρέπει να γαίρονται με την δόξα της γνώσης του Ιησού Χριστού. Αν επιδιώκουμε τον Χριστό και τη Βασιλεία Του, θα έχουμε αρκετή σωματική και υλική άνεση. Αλλά θα έχουμε επίσης την ασφάλεια και την άνεση πέρα από οτιδήποτε μπορεί να μας προσφέρει αυτός ο κόσμος. Πρέπει να Τον αναζητούμε πρώτα και πρέπει να χαιρόμαστε για τη παρουσία Του. Και τότε θα είμαστε ευγνώμονες για ένα αληθινό δώρο, όγι για ένα περαστικό δώρο που είναι ασταθές και αβέβαιο, αλλά για την αγάπη του Θεού, που είναι πολυτιμότερη από οποιοδήποτε θησαυρό, πιο λαμπρή από οποιαδήποτε φήμη και πιο όμορφη από οποιαδήποτε επίγεια ομορφιά. Χαίρετε έν Κυρίω πάντοτε πάλιν έρῶ, χαίρετε!

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE NOVEMBER 2016

FEAR VS. FAITH KNOW THE DIFFERENCE-DISMISS THE ONE AND CLING TO THE OTHER

Faith and fear cannot exist together. Faith is described in Hebrews 11:1 as being "certain of what we do not see." It is an absolute belief that God is constantly working behind the scenes in every area of our lives, even when there is no tangible evidence to support that fact. On the other hand, fear, simply stated, is unbelief or weak belief. As unbelief gains the upper hand in our thoughts, fear takes hold of our emotions. Our deliverance from fear and worry is based on faith, which is the very opposite of unbelief. We need to understand that faith is not something that we can produce in ourselves. Faith is a gift (Ephesians 2:8-9) and is described as a fruit (or characteristic) which is produced in our lives by the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22). The more we learn about God, the more we can see Him working in our lives and the stronger our faith grows. It is was we learn and obtain from PARAKLYSIS.

Here, at St. Demetrios, over the last 23 months, we have learned to strengthen our faith and dismissed fear. 
Hello,

Sorry for the delay, I must have missed this! We have just arrived back from our trip to Greece. Thank you St Demetrius again for this opportunity.


Athens and Mykonos were lovely. We also went to Santorini which was also wonderful. Cloud tours were very accommodating.

St. Demetrios Saves Thessaloniki from the Avars

Even after St. Demetrios' death, he was known to be a great defender and protector of his hometown of Thessaloniki.

Once, there were warriors called Avars who wanted to invade Thessaloniki and they shot arrows and large stones over the wall. Inside the city, the people prayed to St. Demetrios for his protection.

Suddenly, a warrior in shining armor appeared high on the city walls; it was the Holy Martyr, St Demetrios.

He threw down a huge stone that crashed down so loud that the Avars were deafened. Then hundreds and thousands of stones fell down from the walls of Thessaloniki and filled the Avars with such fear that they left but they soon returned to try again. St. Demetrios and his army of warriors threatened them with arrows and stones and the Avars left immediately and never returned. St. Demetrios saved his hometown of Thessaloniki. This was a miracle.

It is said that on each of these stones was written his name, St. Demetrios.

Sunday School students Our showcase their St. Demetrios projects to honor our patron saint. They each made their very own St. Demetrios stones to represent the stones that miraculously fell onto the Avar barbarians deafening them and chasing them from Thessaloniki forever.


