Sunday of all Saints - June 3, 2018 Των Αγιων Παντων - 3 Ιουνιου, 2018



Honouring the friends of God with much reverence, the Prophet-King David says, "But to me, exceedingly honourable are Thy friends, O Lord" (Ps. 138:16). And the divine Apostle, recounting the achievements of the Saints, and setting forth their memorial as an example that we might turn away from earthly things and from sin, and emulate their patience and courage in the struggles for virtue, says, "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every burden, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us" (Heb. 12:1).

This commemoration began as the Sunday (Synaxis) of All Martyrs; to them were added all the ranks of Saints who bore witness (the meaning of "Martyr" in Greek) to Christ in manifold ways, even if occasion did not require the shedding of their blood.

Therefore, guided by the teaching of the Divine Scriptures and Apostolic Tradition, we the pious honour all the Saints, the friends of God, for they are keepers of God's commandments, shining

examples of virtue, and benefactors of mankind. Of course, we honour the known Saints especially on their own day of the year, as is evident in the Menologion. But since many Saints are unknown, and their number has increased with time, and will continue to increase until the end of time, the Church has appointed that once a year a common commemoration be made of all the Saints. This is the feast that we celebrate today. It is the harvest of the coming of the Holy Spirit into the world; it is the "much fruit" brought forth by that "Grain of wheat that fell into the earth and died" (John 12:24); it is the glorification of the Saints as "the foundation of the Church, the perfection of the Gospel, they who fulfilled in deed the sayings of the Saviour" (Sunday of All Saints, Doxasticon of Vespers).

In this celebration, then, we reverently honour and call blessed all the Righteous, the Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Shepherds, Teachers, and Holy Monastics, both men and women alike, known and unknown, who have been added to the choirs of the Saints and shall be added, from the time of Adam until the end of the world, who have been perfected in piety and have glorified God by their holy lives. All these, as well as the orders of the Angels, and especially our most holy Lady and Queen, the Ever-virgin Theotokos Mary, do we honour today, setting their life before us as an example of virtue, and entreating them to intercede in our behalf with God, Whose grace and boundless mercy be with us all. Amen.

Message from Father George

Summer has arrived. A time of relaxation. A time of vacation. Even our spiritual life needs periods of rest. St. Anthony of the Desert described the need for rest by pointing to the string on a bow. If the string is left always in the bow, it eventually breaks from the pressure. The string needs to be loosened so that it does not snap and tear. So, too, in our spiritual lives we sometimes need to slow down and to rest so that we do not feel too much pressure. But this does not mean that we ignore our spiritual lives all summer. Too often, people take a summer break from Church as long as the break that children take from School. This is not good. Let us be different this summer. We can slow down. We can give ourselves a break. But let us remember that prayer is to our spiritual lives what food and water and sleep are to our bodies. Our bodies need to be fed and so do our souls. Remember to come to Church and to partake of the food that never perishes and drink from the water that never leaves us thirsty. Have a wonderful summer! I will see you in Church!

Το καλοκαίρι έχει φτάσει. Μια εποχή για ξεκούραση. Μια εποχή για διακοπές. Ακόμα και η πνευματική μας ζωή χρειάζεται μια περίοδο ξεκούρασης. Ο Άγιος Αντώνιος της Ερήμου περιέγραψε την ανάγκη για ξεκούραση δείχνοντας τη χορδή σε ένα τόξο. Αν η χορδή παραμένει μόνιμα τεντωμένη στο τόξο, κάποια στιγμή θα κοπεί από την πίεση. Η χορδή πρέπει να χαλαρώσει για να μην σπάσει και σκιστεί. Έτσι ακριβώς και με την πνευματική μας ζωή, μερικές φορές χρειάζεται να χαλαρώνουμε, ώστε να μην νιώθουμε πολύ πίεση. Αυτό όμως δεν σημαίνει ότι θα αγνοούμε την πνευματική μας ζωή ολόκληρη την περίοδο του καλοκαιριού. Συχνά, οι άνθρωποι κρατούν το καλοκαιρινό τους διάλλειμα από την εκκλησία όσο τα παιδιά από το σχολείο. Αυτό όμως δεν είναι σωστό. Άς κάνουμε την διαφορά αυτό το καλοκαίρι. Μπορούμε να πάμε με αργούς ρυθμούς. Μπορούμε να δώσουμε στους εαυτούς μας ένα διάλλειμα. Αλλά πρέπει να θυμόμαστε ότι για την πνευματική μας ζωή η προσευχή είναι όπως το φαγητό, το νερό και ο ύπνος για το σώμα μας. Το σώμα μας πρέπει να τραφείς από το φαγητό που δεν τελειώνει ποτέ και να πιείς από το νερό που δεν θα σε αφήσει ποτέ διψασμένο. Να έχεις ένα υπέροχο καλοκαίρι! Θα σε συναντήσω στην εκκλησία!


