





July 25, 2018 – The Dormition of Saint Anna, Mother of the Theotokos

According to tradition, Anna, the ancestor of God, lived for sixty-nine years, and her spouse Joachim, for eighty; according to one account, Saint Joachim died two years before Saint Anna. The Theotokos had been orphaned of both her parents already when she was eleven years of age, when she was living in the Temple. Saint Anna is invoked for conceiving children, and for help in difficult childbirth.

August 15, 2018 - The Dormition of our Most Holy Lady the Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary



When the time drew nigh that our Savior was well-pleased to take His Mother to Himself, He declared unto her through an Angel that three days hence, He would translate her from this temporal life to eternity and bliss. On hearing this, she went up with haste to the Mount of Olives, where she prayed continuously. Giving thanks to God, she returned to her house and prepared whatever was necessary for her burial. While these things were taking place, clouds caught up the Apostles from the ends of the earth, and brought them, at once, to the house of the Mother of God. She blessed the Apostles, and reclining upon her bed with seemliness, gave up her all-holy spirit into the hands of her Son and God. The Apostles took up that God-receiving body and brought it to the sepulchre, while the Angels from Heaven chanted with them, and sent forth her who is higher than the Cherubim. When they had reached the place called Gethsemane, they buried her there with honor, the all-immaculate body of the Theotokos, which was the source of Life. But on the third day after the burial, when they were eating together, and raised up the artos (bread) in Jesus' Name, as was

their custom, the Theotokos appeared in the air, saying "Rejoice" to them. From this they learned concerning the bodily translation of the Theotokos into the Heavens.

Message from Father George

July 2018

When we begin to cultivate our spiritual life, two things are essential. First and foremost, we must be fully committed. We must be determined to turn ourselves away from the things of this world, and toward the things of God. No change will occur without a devotion to change. This is the first thing: to be committed. The second thing is to be realistic. Change is difficult. To alter our lives just a little bit and for just a little while requires great effort. Our habits have been formed over many years, and they do not become new in one day. The monks of the ancient Church would often talk about young monks who came to join them and who would announce very confidently that they intended to fast more than all others, pray more than all others and sleep less than all others, so devoted were they to the monastic life. The older and experienced monks knew what would happen, though. These new monks would soon lose heart and quit. They had set unrealistic goals and would inevitably fail. We must be wise, then, when we try to live a more spiritual life. Do small things. Try to keep the fast on Wednesday and Friday regularly. Try to say a brief prayer each morning and each evening. Make sure to say grace before each meal. Crack the Bible once a day for just a little while. Try to resist those temptations that are part of your everyday life. Be more patient and merciful to the people around you. Select something small, something attainable, and then do it. But do it with zeal and commitment. And the God of light will bless your efforts and show you the path to even greater works.

August 2018

We live in a fallen world. Even when we try to do good, we are trying to do good in a fallen world. This is why even our good works and our desire to draw near to God can often become something selfish that actually turns us away from God. Our good works can easily turn to bad. As St. Paul writes, "I do not do the thing I wish, but I do what I hate" (Romans 7:15). For instance, when we come to Church, this is excellent and essential. But then we start to look around and realize that THIS person or THAT person is not in Church, and we feel that we're special, holier than other people. Instead of drawing closer to the God of love, we are more distant from him. Or we perform some act of charity or generosity, and then we are sure to let everyone know. The very thing that should draw us closer to the God of charity has pushed us deeper into our own selfishness. This does not mean that we should not do good things. We must do even more good works, but we must always recognize that we are doing good in a fallen world. St. Anthony the Great was praying once and saw countless snares and temptations set around him. In despair he asked, "Who can escape these?" Then he heard a voice say, "Humility." When you find yourself seeking praise for your good works, remember the humble road of service. The very fall of humanity occurred because of a lack of humility. As we try to escape the snares of the fallen world, our only and best weapon is humility.

Update on Progress of Remediation

The Church has been notified that additional work needs to be done next door extending the remediation deadline until at least August 27th.

Our Church leaders are working as hard as possible to get the property ready for our use as parking, rebuilding of the Community Center and, God willing, Pan Orthodox Senior housing.

In the meantime, parking is available on Sundays on the lawn, weather permitting, from the State Street entrance.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have been through three and a half years of a transformative period of our Church history. We have completely restored our Church to a reverent sanctuary worthy of praising God, the Father and His Son, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. All funding for these projects came from interests, other than the Church treasury. We have enhanced our personnel with a new priest, a full-time sexton, expanded secretarial office hours to provide parishioners with quality services and, did so, within a balanced budget. We have, finally, had our adjoining contaminated property remediated (cleaned up) with NO EXPENSE being paid out by the Church and without a lawsuit. We have had the property declared in need of redevelopment, as is our right under the law; and are preparing to rebuild our community center, and, God willing, a Pan Orthodox Senior Housing. NONE OF THIS COULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE WITHOUT FAITH. I ask you now, in the last 6 months of this Parish Council term, to KEEP BEING FAITHFUL. We are almost where we can be secure about a bright future. We are advocating every day to get the buildings up and opened. But we are not there yet. YOUR PRAYERS, SUPPORT AND HELP ARE NEEDED TO GET US TO THE END. How can you help?

- 1. **PRAY FOR and HAVE FAITH IN** the efforts of those Church leaders working on our building plans, while asking for the hearts of those who oppose us to be softened.
- 2. **INCREASE YOUR DONATIONS NOW** to the Church in stewardship, brick purchases FOR THE OPERATIONS OF OUR CHURCH and remember us in your LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT to enhance our endowment fund.
- 3. **VOLUNTEER** your services. We need people to help with accounting in the Church office, fundraising to support ads in the Church newsletter and, most importantly, increasing membership.


