

## Saint Paraskeve - July 26 Αγια Παρασκευη - 26 Ιουλιου



Saint Paraskeve was born to pious parents, Agatho and Politia. Since she was born on a Friday (in Greek, Paraskeve), she was given this name, which means "preparation" or "preparedness" (compare Matt. 27:62, Mark 15:42, Luke 23:54, and John 19:31, where 'Friday' is called "the day of the preparation"). From childhood she was instructed in the sacred letters and devoted herself to the study of the divine Scriptures, while leading a monastic life and guiding many to the Faith of Christ. During the reign of the Emperor Antoninus Pius, she was apprehended because she was a Christian and was urged to worship the idols, but she answered with the words of Jeremias: "Let the gods that have not made heaven and the earth perish from off the earth" (Jer. 10:11). Because of this she endured exceedingly painful torments, and was beheaded in the year 140. The faithful pray to her for the healing of eye ailments.

## The Dormition of our Most Holy Lady the Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary - August 15 Κοιμησης της Θεοτοκου - 15 Αυγουστου



When the time drew night that our Savior was well-pleased to take His Mother to Himself, He declared unto her through an Angel that three days hence, He would translate her from this temporal life to eternity and bliss. On hearing this, she went up with haste to the Mount of Olives, where she prayed continuously. Giving thanks to God, she returned to her house and prepared whatever was necessary for her burial. While these things were taking place, clouds caught up the Apostles from the ends of the earth, and brought them, at once, to the house of the Mother of God. She blessed the Apostles, and reclining upon her bed with seemliness, gave up her all-holy spirit into the hands of her Son and God. The Apostles took up that God-receiving body and brought it to the sepulchre, while the Angels from Heaven chanted with them, and sent forth her who is higher than the Cherubim. When they had reached the place called Gethsemane, they buried her there with honor, the all-immaculate body of the Theotokos, which was the source of Life. But on the third day after the burial, when they were

eating together, and raised up the artos (bread) in Jesus' Name, as was their custom, the Theotokos appeared in the air, saying "Rejoice" to them. From this they learned concerning the bodily translation of the Theotokos into the Heavens.



## Message from Father George

When we begin to cultivate our spiritual life, two things are essential. First and foremost, we must be fully committed. We must be determined to turn ourselves away from the things of this world, and toward the things of God. No change will occur without a devotion to change. This is the first thing: to be committed. The second thing is to be realistic. Change is difficult. To alter our lives just a little bit and for just a little while requires great effort. Our habits have been formed over many years, and they do not become new in one day. The monks of the ancient Church would often talk about young monks who came to join them and who would announce very confidently that they intended to fast more than all others, pray more than all others and sleep less than all others, so devoted were they to the monastic life. The older and experienced monks knew what would happen, though. These new monks would soon lose heart and quit. They had set unrealistic goals and would inevitably fail. We must be wise, then, when we try to live a more spiritual life. Do small things. Try to keep the fast on Wednesday and Friday regularly. Try to say a brief prayer each morning and each evening. Make sure to say grace before each meal. Crack the Bible once a day for just a little while. Try to resist those temptations that are part of your everyday life. Be more patient and merciful to the people around you. Select something small, something attainable, and then do it. But do it with zeal and commitment. And the God of light will bless your efforts and show you the path to even greater works.
