#### March 25 – Annunciation of the Theotokos 25 Μαρτιου – Ευαγγελισμος της Υπεραγιας Θεοτοκου

Six months after John the Forerunner's conception, the Archangel Gabriel was sent by God to Nazareth, a town of Galilee, unto Mary the Virgin, who had come forth from the Temple a mature maiden (see Nov. 21). According to the tradition handed down by the Fathers, she had been betrothed to Joseph four months. On coming to Joseph's house, the Archangel declared: "Rejoice, thou Full of Grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women." After some consideration, and turmoil of soul, and fear because of this greeting, the Virgin, when she had finally obtained full assurance concerning God's unsearchable condescension and the ineffable dispensation that was to take place through her, and believing that all things are possible to the Most

High, answered in humility: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word." And at this, the Holy Spirit came upon her, and the power of the Most high overshadowed her all-blameless womb, and the Son and Word of God, Who existed before the ages, was conceived past speech and understanding, and became flesh in her immaculate body (Luke 1:26-38).

Bearing in her womb the Uncontainable One, the blessed Virgin went with haste from Nazareth to the hill country of Judea, where Zacharias had his dwelling; for she desired to find Elizabeth her kinswoman and rejoice together with her, because, as she had learned from the Archangel, Elizabeth had conceived in her old age. Furthermore, she wished to tell her of the great things that the Mighty One had been well-pleased to bring to pass in her, and she greeted Elizabeth and drew nigh to her. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, she felt her sixmonth-old babe, Saint John the Baptist, prophesied of the dawning of the spiritual Sun. Immediately, the aged Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and recognized her as the Mother of her Lord, and with a great voice blessed her and the Fruit that she held within herself. The Virgin also, moved by a supernatural rejoicing in the spirit, glorified her God and Savior, saying: "My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour," and the rest, as the divine Luke hath recorded (1:39-55).

## Message from Father George





The last Sunday before the start of Lent is called by different names. It is usually known as "Cheesefare Sunday," because this is the last day we can eat dairy and egg products. In other words, we bid "farewell" to Cheese. But this Sunday also has a less common name - Forgiveness Sunday. Forgiveness Sunday reminds us to seek forgiveness of our sins during Lent. And this Sunday reminds us not only that we need to seek forgiveness, but also that we need to give forgiveness. In fact, we will only get forgiveness if we can give forgiveness. This is something we say every time we recite the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." We should also keep in mind the parable of the Unforgiving Servant in Matthew 18:21-35. A servant owes his master a huge sum of money. But as the servant begs forgiveness, the master pardons the debt, even though it was enormous. When this same servant, however, sees a fellow servant who owes him only a small amount, he refuses to forgive the debt. When the master learns that the servant who was forgiven a great debt did not himself forgive a small debt, he has that servant punished severely. The message is clear: we will receive forgiveness if we can give forgiveness. Sometimes, of course, forgiveness is very difficult. So we may need to start small. We may not be able to spend time with a person, for example, but we can pray for them. This will not change the person who has wronged us, but it can change how we feel when we think of them. The anger that become so enraged becomes a little less powerful when we say, "God bless them and bring them your salvation." The more we do this, the easier it becomes, and we slowly are able to be reconciled to our enemies. At other times, people may have wronged us in ways that seem unforgiveable. Here, too, we are not required to resume a perfect relationship with people who are cruel or abusive. But after we distance ourselves and secure our own position of strength, we can pray for their souls. We can pray for their forgiveness, and in this way, we begin to forgive them as well. Instead of being consumed by anger, we find ourselves consumed by God's love for his creation and for all people. We are drawn closer to God. We become more like God. As we erase the sins that others have committed against us, we feel the mercy and forgiveness that we ourselves seek for our own sins.

Η τελευταία Κυριακή πριν από την έναρξη της Σαρακοστής καλείται με διαφορετικά ονόματα. Είναι συνήθως γνωστή ως "Τυρινής", επειδή αυτή είναι η τελευταία μέρα που μπορούμε να φάμε γαλακτοκομικά προϊόντα και προϊόντα αυγών. Αλλά αυτή η Κυριακή έχει και ένα λιγότερο κοινό όνομα - η Κυριακή της Συγχωρήσεως. Αυτή η Κυριακή μας θυμίζει να αναζητήσουμε συγχώρεση των αμαρτιών μας κατά τη διάρκεια της Σαρακοστής. Και αυτή η Κυριακή υπενθυμίζει όχι μόνο ότι πρέπει να αναζητήσουμε συγχώρεση εμείς, αλλά και ότι πρέπει να δώσουμε συγχώρεση στους άλλους. Θα λάβουμε συγχώρεση μόνο αν μπορούμε να δώσουμε συγχώρεση. Αυτό λέμε κάθε φορά που απαγγέλλουμε την Κυριακή Προσευχή: «καὶ ἄφες ἡμῖν τὰ ὀφειλήματα ἡμῶν, ὡς καὶ ἡμεῖς ἀφίεμεν τοῖς ὀφειλέταις ήμῶν». Πρέπει επίσης να έχουμε κατά νου την παραβολή του Ανελεήτου Υπηρέτη στο Ευαγγέλιο κατά Ματθαίον (18: 21-35). Ένας υπηρέτης οφείλει στον κύριό του ένα τεράστιο χρηματικό άθροισμα. Αλλά καθώς ο υπηρέτης ικετεύει τη συγχώρεση, ο κύριος χαρίζει το χρέος, εάν και ήταν τεράστιο. Όταν ο ίδιος αυτός υπηρέτης, όμως, βλέπει έναν συνάδελφό του που του χρωστάει ένα μικρό άθροισμα, αρνείται να συγχωρήσει το χρέος. Όταν ο Κύριος μάθει ότι ο υπηρέτης, ο οποίος είχε συγχωρεθεί με ένα μεγάλο χρέος, δεν συγχωρούσε ο ίδιος ένα μικρό χρέος, τιμώρησε αυστηρά αυτόν τον υπηρέτη. Το μήνυμα είναι σαφές: θα λάβουμε συγχώρηση αν μπορούμε να δώσουμε συγχώρεση. Μερικές φορές, βέβαια, η συγχώρεση είναι πολύ δύσκολη και πρέπει να αρχίσουμε σιγά σιγά. Ίσως δεν μπορούμε να περάσουμε χρόνο με ένα άτομο, παραδείγματος χάριν, αλλά μπορούμε να προσευχηθούμε γι 'αυτόν. Η προσευχή μας δεν θα αλλάξει τον άνθρωπο που μας αδίκησε, αλλά μπορεί να αλλάξει την δική μας καρδίαν. Ο θυμός που γίνεται τόσο εξοργισμένος γίνεται λίγο λιγότερο ισχυρός όταν λέμε: "Ο Θεός να τους ευλογεί και να τους φέρει τη σωτηρία σας". Όσο περισσότερο κάνουμε αυτό, τόσο πιο εύκολο γίνεται η συγχώρεση, και μπορούμε αργά να είμαστε συμφιλιωμένοι με τους εχθρούς μας. Μπορούμε να προσευχόμαστε για τη συγχώρησή τους και με αυτόν τον τρόπο αρχίζουμε να τους συγχωρούμε επίσης. Αντί να καταναλισκόμαστε από τον θυμό, βρίσκουμε στον εαυτό μας την αγάπη του Θεού για όλους τους ανθρώπους. Μας έλκεται πιο κοντά στον Θεό. Γινόμαστε περισσότερο σαν τον Θεό. Καθώς σβήνουμε τις αμαρτίες που έχουν διαπράξει άλλοι εναντίον μας, αισθανόμαστε το έλεος και τη συγχώρεση που εμείς οι ίδιοι επιδιώκουμε για τις δικές μας αμαρτίες.
