October 26, 2018 - The Holy Great Martyr Demetrios, the Myrrh-Streamer 26 Οκτωβριου, 2018 - Αγιος Δημητριος, ο Μυροβλυτης

Saint Demetrios was a Thessalonian, a most pious son of pious and noble parents, and a teacher of the Faith of Christ. When Maximian first came to Thessaloniki in 290, he raised the Saint to the rank of Duke of Thessaly. But when it was discovered that the Saint was a Christian, he was arrested and kept bound in a bathhouse. While the games were under way in the city, Maximian was a spectator there. A certain friend of his, a barbarian who was a notable wrestler, Lyaeus by name, waxing haughty because of the height and strength of his body, boasted in the stadium and challenged the citizens to a contest with him. All that fought with him were defeated. Seeing this, a certain youth named Nestor, acquaintance of Demetrios', came to the Saint in the bathhouse and asked his blessing to fight Lyaeus single-handed. Receiving this blessing and sealing himself with the sign of the precious Cross, he presented himself in the stadium, and said, "O God of Demetrios, help me!" and straightway he engaged Lyaeus in combat and stroke him with a mortal blow to the heart, leaving the former boaster lifeless upon the earth. Maximian was sorely grieved over this, and when he learned who was the cause of this defeat, he commanded straightway and Demetrios was pierced with lances while he was yet in the bathhouse, As for Nestor, Maximian commanded that he be slain with his own sword.

The world has found in you a great champion in time of peril, as you emerged the victor in routing the barbarians. For as you brought to naught the boasts of Lyaeus, imparting courage to Nestor in the stadium, in like manner, holy one, great Martyr Demetrios, invoke Christ God for us, that He may grant us His great mercy.

Message from Father George

October is the month of Saint Demetrios, and our Parish is reminded every October 26th of our great defender and champion. Saint Demetrios, of course, is first and foremost associated with the city of Thessaloniki, where he was martyred. A wonderful Church honors the great Saint in that city, and all the people of Thessaloniki have known for centuries that St. Demetrios is their defender and patron. In the 14th century, Saint Gregory of Palamas was the Archbishop of Thessaloniki, and he delivered a beautiful homily on Saint Demetrios, explaining that the Christian character of that city is entirely indebted to the legacy of Demetrios. What Palamas says about Thessaloniki is worth remembering, because it applies, also, to us, as well.

Palamas begins his reflections on Saint Demetrios by quoting the phrase from the Bible which says, "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:6, 8)." Saint Demetrios, he says, died in the same way and with the same result. Thessaloniki was not a Christian city when Demetrios was martyred, but after his death it has become a center of piety and Christian devotion. Through his death, Palamas says, the whole city was turned to Christ. No longer do Christians have to hide in fear in secluded spaces, but have filled the city with Churches. No longer do they do they need to share their faith in secret, fearing punishment, but have spread the Gospel to the ends of the earth. In imitation of Christ, Demetrios died to save his city, and his death is the foundation of that city's faith. It is also the foundation of the faith of each and every one of us. As we turn to a world that needs the message of the Gospel more than ever, we need to think of ways to die to our greed and to our egotism and to our selfish impulses, and to transform our families and our Parish and our town in imitation of Saint Demetrios, who lived in imitation of Christ.

Memorial Tributes to Tom and Sylvia Kress - Sunday, September 23, 2018

President Marina Corodemus solemnly addressed parishioners in regard to the One-Year Memorial for Sylvia Kress who is considered among the great people of our Church, a Mother of our Church. She came to Perth Amboy after marrying Tom Kress and, together, they became Ambassadors of our Church. Together, they were significant donors and benefactors of our Church. Now, in her bequest, Sylvia was extraordinarily generous to Philotimo and the Church she and Tom loved so dearly. With this in mind, President Corodemus announced that they both will be memorialized as part of our building project with the naming of the "Tom and Sylvia Kress Community Center" to which our parishioners responded with a warm applause. She will introduce a resolution for consideration to the Philotimo Building Group.

Philoptochos President, Stella Wacker, told endearing stories of Sylvia's devotion to Philoptochos which, at times, may have seemed overwhelming but was always well-intended through her deep caring and commitment to accomplishing her goals. Sylvia's devotion to Philoptochos was always unconditional and her generosity to their mission was admirable.

Sylvia's nephew, Simon Bogiages, spoke of Tom and Sylvia's most caring and good-hearted nature. The Church and its parishioners became their family; their children, which is why they were so generous on many levels. They were available to the Church 24/7; all times of the day. He, sincerely, thanked everyone on behalf of the Kress family for recognizing their beloved aunt and uncle on this day.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Faithful of Saint Demetrios Church,

October is Saint Demetrios' month. All efforts and thoughts of this month should be rightfully surrounded by and consumed with, the worship and glory of St. Demetrios and through his intercession, the protection of our Church and people by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Last Christmas, I made a pilgrimage for our Church's 100th Anniversary, to Thessaloniki to visit and worship at the magnificent Church of Saint Demetrios. The stunning architecture and scale of that incredible Church adorned with precious century-old iconography and sacred relics are enough to satisfy any aesthetic-pleasing person. But more so, to realize that you are at the actual tomb of the Great Martyr Demetrios and smell the myrrh emitting from the tomb to this day, along with the bee's wax aroma of hundreds of candles by the faithful, incensed atmosphere, and the intoning of ancient Byzantine melodies, it is was a glimpse into the heavenly realm.

Here in Perth Amboy, centuries after Saint Paul went to Thessaloniki to preach and many hundreds of martyrs later, who sacrificed so we could worship openly and without fear or peril, we still honor Saint Demetrios, Saint Nestor and the God-man they gave up their lives for, Jesus the Christ. I will never forget the last movement of Astrinidis Oratory that was so beautifully performed by the Arcadian Chorale for us last year (https://youtu.be/VeWaiOaEzqs). As the two saints were rising into heaven while the chorus sang the Alleluia refrain, it was the closest glimpse of theosis I have experienced.

This October 25th (Thursday, 7:00 p.m.), if you cannot be in Thessaloniki for Vespers, then make sure you are here in Perth Amboy where we do experience the presence of Saint Demetrios, the blessings of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and freedom to worship without fear or peril. Many visiting priests will join us for Vespers, followed by a reception by our Philoptochos. On the 26th of October, the Feast Day, Father George will have Liturgy at 9:00 a.m. followed by coffee. The celebration continues on Sunday, October 28th, when directly after the Divine Liturgy, we will have a Family Church Dance downstairs with Live Greek Music by the Stavros Theodorou Band. Call the Church office to reserve your table before we are sold out. This October, PRAY, LOVE, EAT AND DANCE, RIGHT HERE AT SAINT DEMETRIOS IN PERTH AMBOY, NEW JERSEY.

Dear Faithful of Saint Demetrios,

Last month, we were witness to the magnificent generosity of **Sylvia and Tom Kress**, of blessed memory, who gave a very GENEROUS GIFT financially donated to our Church. This incredible conveyance came at a time when we are at the very beginning of our building project and success of our endowment fund; in short, an answer to our prayers. With this generosity, we will be able to invest in ourselves and GROW our money, not simply stockpile it for everyday needs, until it dwindles down to nothing. More importantly, this benevolence should serve as an example for each of us to help our Church and PLAN for it from now. Below and attached is some information to help you better understand and, hopefully, encourage you to act like Tom and Sylvia to prepare and care for the future of Saint Demetrios through planned giving. Please read and act to help give to your Church's future and be part of tomorrow for others to enjoy what you have had in your lifetime by simply adding to or creating a will or gift form.

Q. I am considering make a gift to the Church, but I'm not wealthy. Can an average person leave a gift?

A. Definitely! Although very large gifts receive the most publicity, you can leave a gift of any amount. Thousands of Americans leave a retirement plan or life insurance policy to a nonprofit organization or give bequests through their Wills. All gifts are meaningful and greatly appreciated by the Church. These gifts represent a way that your name can be associated with the Church long after you are gone.

Q. Do I have to rewrite my Will to leave a gift to the church?

A. Fortunately, no, you do not need to re-think your entire estate plan in order to leave something to the Church. You can make a gift by listing the Church as the beneficiary on a retirement account or on a life insurance policy you don't need. Also, you can simply ask your attorney to amend your will with a codicil that includes a bequest to the Church so that you don't need to make a whole new Will.

Q. What if I am not sure how much money will be left to give?

A. There are many ways you can make sure you are comfortable with the final amount to be given. You can leave a percentage of your estate, that way you don't have to worry about a specific dollar amount. Also, many people find that leaving all or a percentage of the balance in a retirement plan is a simple and easy way to address this concern. You can also leave any other specific asset, such as a certificate of deposit, securities, or real estate, or name the Church as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy that your family may no longer need.

Q. Can I make a charitable gift that also provides financial security for my future?

A. Yes! You may want to speak with a professional advisor about setting up a charitable remainder trust or a charitable gift annuity that will provide an immediate tax deduction plus give you income during your life or the life of you and your spouse. The Church receives your gift after your death.

Q. What if I don't have a Will? Can I still make a Legacy Gift?

A. Yes, you can. It is important to have a Will and you should discuss this with your attorney and/or financial advisor. However, if you decide you don't need a Will, you can make a legacy gift in many different ways. You can list the Church as the beneficiary on a retirement account or a life insurance policy. You can complete a "Gift Form" that instructs the executor of your estate to make a specific gift from your assets.



Those of you who only lately came to know Sylvia missed knowing her in her lovely youth, smart, alert, aware, energetic and friendly.




