The Theophany of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ - Ayla Oeopaveia tou Kupiou



About the beginning of our Lord's thirtieth year, John the Forerunner, who was some six months older than Our Saviour according to the flesh, and had lived in the wilderness since his childhood, received a command from God and came into the parts of the Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance unto the remission of sins. Then our Saviour also came from Galilee to the Jordan, and sought and received baptism though He was the Master and John was but a servant. Whereupon, there came to pass those marvelous deeds, great and beyond nature: the Heavens were opened, the Spirit descended in the form of a dove upon Him that was being baptized and the voice was heard from the Heavens hearing witness that this was the beloved Son of God, now baptized as a man (Matt. 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:1-22). From these events the

Divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ and the great mystery of the Trinity were demonstrated. It is also from this that the present feast is called "Theophany," that is, the divine manifestation, God's appearance among men. On this venerable day the sacred mystery of Christian baptism was inaugurated; henceforth also began the saving preaching of the Kingdom of the Heavens.

Lord, when You were baptized in the Jordan, the veneration of the Trinity was revealed. For the voice of the Father gave witness to You, calling You Beloved, and the Spirit, in the guise of a dove, confirmed the certainty of His words. Glory to You, Christ our God, who appeared and enlightened the world.

Message from Father George

The month of January begins with one of the great feasts of the Church, the feast of Epiphany on January 6th. This feast celebrates the baptism of Christ, and also goes under the name Theophany. The word Epiphany means "Revelation" or "Manifestation." Where there is an epiphany, it means that something has been made known which was hidden. The word "Theophany" is similar, but even more specific. It means that God, who has been hidden, has been made known. The baptism of Christ is called an "Epiphany" or a "Theophany" because it is in Christ's baptism that the Holy Trinity is made known fully for the first time. The voice of the Father comes from heaven, while the Spirit descends in the form of a dove, and Jesus is revealed to be the Son of God. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are revealed in this scene, and so the month of January begins with a focus on the Holy Trinity, a divine epiphany, a theophany. But the entire month continues in the same way, because we honor in the month of January so many saints who were great theologians and who explained and clarified the Orthodox faith. In their teaching, we see God revealed and made clear. Their teaching is a form of a theophany. These great saints are people like Saint Athanasios the Great, whose teaching in the 4th century gave birth to the Nicene Creed that we recite in Church, and Saint Cyril of Alexandria, who clarified in the 5th century how we should understand properly the role of Mary in Christ's birth. We honor them together on January 18. We also honor Saint Gregory the Theologian on January 25th, and he is given the title "Theologian" to emphasize his essential role in defending the faith of the Nicene Creed just a few decades after it was written. Finally, at the end of the month on January 30th, we honor the "The Three Great Hierarchs," great bishops of the Church. One of them is Saint Gregory the Theologian, and the other two are Saint Basil the Great and Saint John Chrysostom, both of whom were not only great theologians and preachers, but also authors of the Divine Liturgies of our Church. Saint Basil is also celebrated on his own on January 1st. So, January is a month of Theophanies, of divine revelations, first in the Baptism of Christ, and then in the lives and teaching of the great Saints that we honor in this month.


Happy and Healthy New Year to Everyone!
