#### October 26 - The Holy Great Martyr Demetrios, the Myrrh-Streamer

Saint Demetrios was a Thessalonian, a most pious son of pious and noble parents, and a teacher of the Faith of Christ. When Maximian first came to Thessaloniki in 290, he raised the Saint to the rank of Duke of Thessaly. But when it was discovered that the Saint was a Christian, he was arrested and kept bound in a bathhouse. While the games were under way in the city, Maximian was a spectator there. A certain friend of his, a barbarian who was a notable wrestler, Lyaeus by name, waxing haughty because of the height and strength of his body, boasted in the stadium and challenged the citizens to a contest with him. All that fought with him were defeated. Seeing this, a certain youth named Nestor, acquaintance of Demetrios, came to the Saint in the bathhouse and asked his blessing to fight Lyaeus single-handed. Receiving this blessing and sealing himself with the sign of the precious Cross, he presented himself in the stadium, and said, "O God of Demetrios, help me!" and straightway he engaged Lyaeus in combat and stroke him with a mortal blow to the heart, leaving the former boaster lifeless upon the earth. Maximian was sorely grieved over this, and when he learned who was the cause of this defeat, he commanded straightway and Demetrios was pierced with lances while he was yet in the bathhouse. As for Nestor, Maximian commanded that he be slain with his own sword.

#### **Apolytikion of Demetrios, the Myrrh-Streamer**

The world has found in you a great champion in time of peril, as you emerged the victor in routing the barbarians. For as you brought to naught the boasts of Lyaeus, imparting courage to Nestor in the stadium, in like manner, holy one, great Martyr Demetrios, invoke Christ God for us, that He may grant us His great mercy.



#### 26 Οκτωβριου - Αγιος Δημητριος, ο Μυροβλυτης

Ο ενδοξος μεγαλομαστυσας Δημητσίος εζησε στα χοονία των αυτοκρατόρων της Ρωμης Διοκλητίανου (284-304) και Μαξιμιανου (286-305). Καταγόταν από τη Θεσσαλονίκη. Από τους γονείς του πησε την ευσέβεια και ο ίδιος υπησξε διδασκαλός της χριστίανικης πίστης.

Οταν καπότε ο Μαξιμιανός πηγε στη Θεσσαλονική, ακουγοντάς όσα ελεγάν όλοι για την αφέτη και τη μεγάλη πιστή του Δημητφίου στον Θεό, διετάξε και τον συνελάβαν και τον φυλακισάν. Ο αυτοκρατόρας αυτός καμάρωνε τον Λυαίος, που ήταν γιγαντόσωμος και πόλυ δυνατός και τους ξεπερνούσε όλους. Ο Μαξιμιανός θελοντάς να τίμησει το Λυαίο, παρακινούσε τους Θεσσαλονικείς να μπούν στο στάδιο και να παλεψούν μαζί του.

Τοτε ενας νέος στην ηλικία χριστιανός, που τον ελέγαν Νέστορα, επισκέφθηκε τον Αγίο Δημητρίο στην φυλακή και του είπε: "Δουλε του Θεού, θέλω να αντιμετωπίσω τον Λυαίο. Προσευχήσου για μένα στον Κυρίο." Ο Αγίος, αφού πρωτα έκανε στο μετώπο του Νέστορα το σημείο του σταυρού, του είπε: "Και το Λυαίο θα νίκησεις, αλλα και για το Χρίστο θα μαρτυρησεις!" Ετσί λοιπον ο Νέστορας, παιρνοντάς δυναμή και θαρρός από τα λογία του Αγίου Δημητρίου, αντιμέτωπίσε τον Λυαίο, τον θανατώσε και ταπείνωσε την αλαζονεία του.

Ο Μαξιμιανός ντροπιαστηκε πόλυ από το γεγονός. Ερευνωντάς όμως το θεμά, πληροφορήθηκε ότι αιτίος της σφαγής του Λυαίου ήταν ο Αγίος Δημητρίος. Χωρίς χρονότριβη εστείλε στη φυλακή στρατιώτες, με την εντόλη να λογχίσουν την πλευρά του πέρα ως πέρα.

Οι στρατιωτες εκτελεσαν παραυτα την εντολη κι ετσι ο ενδοξος μεγαλομαρτυρας Δημητριος παρεδωσε στον Κυριο την ψυχη του και κοσμηθηκε με το αμαραντο στεφανι του μαρτυριου. Μετα το μαρτυρικο του θανατο, ο Αγιος επιτελουσε παρα πολλα θαυματα και παραδοξες θεραπειες.

Παλι με εντολη του Μαξιμιανου, αποκεφαλιστηκε απο τους στρατιωτες και ο Αγιος Νεστορας. Ο Αγιος Νεστορας θανατωθηκε με τη χρησιμοποιηση του ιδιού του ξιφούς του, με το οποίο είχε νίκησει τον Λυαίο.

#### Απολυτικιον Δημητοιου του Μυφοβλητου

Μεγαν ευρατο εν τοις κινδυνοις, σε υπερμαχον η οικουμενη, Αθλοφορε τα εθνη τροπουμενον. Ως ουν Λυαιου καθείλες την επαρσίν, εν τω σταδίω θαρρυνάς τον Νεστορά, ουτώς Αγιε, Μεγαλομάρτυς Δημητρίε, Χρίστον τον Θεον ικέτευε, δωρησασθαί ημίν το μεγά ελέος.





#### Message from Father George

Dear Parishioners of Saint Demetrios,

October is one of the important months in our parish, as we celebrate the feast of Saint Demetrios the Great Martyr on October 26th. Saint Demetrios was killed in one of the great Roman persecutions of Christians in the early 4<sup>th</sup> century. He was a martyr who gave his life for Christ. The word "martyr" is originally a legal word that means a "witness." And the word "martyria" means evidence or testimony. A "martyr" offers "martyria" (testimony) in court. When Christians, therefore, were called to prove whether or not they were Christians, they gave their "martyria," their testimony, and proved their identity. They showed that they were different from the world around them and the world persecuted them. When they were killed, they were called "martyrs." We are not in danger right now of being killed for being Christians, but we must still offer "martyria" of our faith. We must still show to the world and to the people around us that we are Christians. We must live lives of discipline and selfcontrol, even as the world offers the opposite. We must live lives of mercy and forgiveness, even as the world offers the opposite. And we must live lives of self-sacrifice and Christian love, even as the world urges greater and greater selfishness and self-indulgence. When we do this, we are offering a testimony of our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. We are martyrs.

#### PTO News




#### Sunday School
