

Κοιμησης της Υπεραγιας Θεοτοκου The Dormition of our Most Holy Lady the Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary 15 Αυγουστου - August 15



When the time drew night that our Savior was well-pleased to take His Mother to Himself, He declared unto her through an Angel that three days hence, He would translate her from this temporal life to eternity and bliss. On hearing this, she went up with haste to the Mount of Olives, where she prayed continuously. Giving thanks to God, she returned to her house and prepared whatever was necessary for her burial. While these things were taking place, clouds caught up the Apostles from the

ends of the earth, and brought them, at once, to the house of the Mother of God. She blessed the Apostles, and reclining upon her bed with seemliness, gave up her all-holy spirit into the hands of her Son and God. The Apostles took up that God-receiving body and brought it to the sepulchre, while the Angels from Heaven chanted with them, and sent forth her who is higher than the Cherubim. When they had reached the place called Gethsemane, they buried her there with honor, the all-immaculate body of the Theotokos, which was the source of Life. But on the third day after the burial, when they were eating together, and raised up the artos (bread) in Jesus' Name, as was their custom, the Theotokos appeared in the air, saying "Rejoice" to them. From this they learned concerning the bodily translation of the Theotokos into the Heavens.

Η Υψωσις του Τιμιου Σταυρου The Elevation of the Venerable and Life-Giving Cross 14 Σεπτεμβριου - September 14



Σημερα ο Σταυρος ανυψωνεται και ολοκληρη η κτιση Του απελευθερωνεται απο τη φθορα.

Η Αγια Ελένη πηγε στους Αγιους Τοπους να προσκυνησει και να ευχαριστησει τον Κυριο για τους θριαμβους του γιου της, Μεγαλου Κωνσταντινου, ο οποιος ειχε συνειδηση οτι η νικη του επηλθε λογω της φανερωσης του σημειου του Τιμιου Σταυρου, τον οποιο ειδε στον ουρανο. Φθανοντας στο Γολγοθα, διεταξε να σκαψουν το μερος, απο το οποιο ανασυρθηκαν τρεις σταυροι. Μη γνωριζοντας ποιος ειναι ο Τιμιος Σταυρος, ο επισκοπος Ιεροσολυμων Μακαριος ακουμπησε το σωμα μιας ευσεβεστατης νεκρης γυναικας διαδοχικα στους τρεις σταυρους. Μολις το νεκρο σωμα της γυναικας ακουμπησε τον Τιμιο Σταυρο, αναστηθηκε.

Τοτε, η Αγια Ελενη προσκυνησε το Ζωοποιο Σταυρο. Στη συνεχεια ο επισκοπος

ανεβηκε στον αμβωνα και σηκωσε με τα δυο του χερια τον Τιμιο Σταυρο, φανερωνοντας τον σε ολους τους χριστιανους, οι οποιοι μ'ενα στομα φωναξαν το «Κυριε ελεησον». Απο τοτε, οι Αγιοι Πατερες ορισαν να γιορταζεται η Παγκοσμια Υψωση του Τιμιου Σταυρου, για να δοξαζεται ο Χριστος που σταυρωθηκε σ'αυτον.

Σημερα επιτελειται αναμνηση και του γεγονοτος οταν ο αυτοκρατορας Ηρακλειτος παρεδωσε τον Τιμιο Σταυρο στο ναο της Αναστασεως, μετα απο λιτανεια στην οποια ελαβε μερος ανυποδητος και ντυμενος ταπεινα. Τον Τιμιο Σταυρο παρελαβε ο Πατριαρχης Ζαχαριας και ολοι μαζι εψαλλαν το τροπαριο «Σωσον, Κυριε, τον λαον σου και ευλογησον την κληρονομιαν σου νικας τοις Βασιλευσι κατα βαρβαρων δωρουμενος και το σον φυλαττων δια του Σταυρου σου πολιτευμα».

Saint Helen, the mother of Saint Constantine the Great, when she was already advanced in years, undertook, in her great piety, the hardships of a journey to Jerusalem in search of the cross, about the year 325. A temple to Aphrodite had been raised up by the Emperor Hadrian upon Golgotha, to defile and cover with oblivion the place where the saving Passion had been suffered. The venerable Helen had the statue of Aphrodite destroyed, and the earth removed, revealing the Tomb of our Lord, and three crosses. Of these, it was believed that one must be that of our Lord, the other two of the thieves crucified with Him; but Saint Helen was at a loss which one might be the Wood of our salvation. At the inspiration of Saint Macarius, Archbishop of Jerusalem, a lady of Jerusalem, who was already at the point of death from a certain disease, was brought to touch the crosses, and as soon as she came near to the Cross of our Lord, she was made perfectly whole. Consequently, the precious Cross was lifted on high by Archbishop Macarius of Jerusalem; as he stood on the ambo, and when the people beheld it, they cried out, "Lord have mercy." It should be noted that after its discovery, a portion of the venerable Cross was taken to Constantinople as a blessing. The rest was left in Jerusalem in the magnificent church built by Saint Helen, until the year 614. At that time, the Persians plundered Palestine and took the Cross to their own country. Late, in the year 628, Emperor Heraclius set out on a military campaign, retrieved the Cross, and after bringing it to Constantinople, himself escorted it back to Jerusalem, where he restored it to its place. Rest from labour. A Fast is observed today, whatever day of the week it may be.

Dear Parishioners:

This note was penned the day after the festival and the day before summer. We await the results of each. If you were absent from the festival, a BIG project, then you saved yourself some effort but that was more than offset by what you missed. That is not being detailed here but, just last night the teamwork, speed and kindness of the volunteers in disassembling and removing grills, fryers, tents, wiring, tables, cash registers and chairs, among other things, were remarkable, this after three days of toil in heat and cold. Our volunteers and the festival had an impact - even the visitors were happy and polite!

Some of us are reluctant to undertake a project or even continue one already begun, even when it would benefit us. We say "yes" but our actions show "no." We are called to follow Christ and we say "yes" each year by writing a check to remain a member of Saint Demetrios in Perth Amboy but that is where it ends. Our project doesn't advance. The seasons come and go. We have saved some effort but don't know what we are missing.

This has nothing to do with summer or the festival but surely life is ironic for those who toil for some things that go away and fail to toil for something infinitely greater that does not.

President's Message/Parish Council News

The month of May was a very active month for our beloved community: Indoor Olympics, Clergy Laity at the Venetian in Garfield NJ and, Ministry Awards, Mother's Day, Clergy Laity at Waterfall Restaurant, Wilmington, Delaware, Graduation Day, General Meeting and Outdoor Olympics, to name a few major events.

Maintenance activities: The Parish Council and other church members helped to replace the aging roof of the boiler room, demolished and discarded the existing air conditioning unit. The new HVAC unit was installed. The entire project cost \$40,700, which \$36,000 was donated by parish members.

Due to the depleting funds, we had to organize (2) separate festivals this year and participate on the 4th of July city wide celebration event at the Perth Amboy Waterfront. The 4th of July event will be on July 2nd. The first festival was June 17, 18 &19. The September festival dates have not been selected yet. However, since our Saint Demetrios family is small in number compared to neighboring parishes, our volunteers are "one and the same" for all of the above events, church repairs and youth activities. I would ask you kindly to help us in any way possible (physical volunteering, monetary support, baking foods and/or pastries) or by purchasing goods and ingredients related to these events. Some of our generous food donors are the Barge, the New Coney Island Restaurants in Perth Amboy, Evan's Restaurant in Matawan and Marco Polo Restaurant in Summit. Other donors are local diners and restaurants including The Greek Store in Kenilworth. All monetary donations should be either a business or personal check made out to Saint Demetrios Church with a note "September Festival". Monetary donations are for chicken for souvlakia; pork for souvlakia; plastic blue & white checkered tablecloths; Greek Wine and Greek Beer.

Final Thoughts:

1. Besides honoring the achievements of our immediate youth members of our community, let's not forget one more young person whose family currently resides in Florida, Paige Ahladianakis, as she obtained a bachelor's degree in the Biomedical Engineering field from the University of Hawaii Pacific.

3. Sadly, Helen Catelanos' house was destroyed by a devastating fire while she was hospitalized for a medical procedure at the New Brunswick Hospital. Currently, Helen is doing well and is recuperating at her Granddaughter's home. We wish Helen a quick recovery and we would like to extend a helping hand to her by any means.














Baptism


