# A message from the Stewardship Chairman

St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church is one of the most important institutions I can think of. I say this because it affords us as a spiritual family a vehicle to express our love and faith to the Lord. When we come together in prayer, education, and fellowship, we fortify ourselves as a family, build up our church, and do good things in the name of the Lord. Stewardship is the means to accomplish these goals.

There are many ways that we show our unconditional love to the Lord and His church. The most significant way is through Prayer. How many times in a crisis - whether it's health, our family, emotional duress, or financial - do we cry out to the Lord for His help and Mercy? How about the other side when times are good...do we take time out to thank the Lord for all His blessings? We can do that by actively participating in the Divine Liturgy and Eucharist. Is it too much to ask to surrender ourselves to the Lord from 10 am to 1130 am every Sunday? Doesn't this time really belong to the Lord instead of us? The Church provides us an opportunity to heal every week from the stress that the secular world offers us. This is by far the most important pillar of an effective faith-based church.

We can pass down Knowledge to our children to ensure the continuation of our faith for generations to come. Although it's important to understand the native Greek language of our hierarchs and forefathers, it is even more important to learn the Orthodox language of love Jesus Christ has taught us.

Thirdly, fellowship is the glue that binds us together as a family. Social events, youth programs, our ministries, festivals, dances, and fundraisers bring us together to work towards a common goal in a relaxed and loving environment in the name of our Lord. We should always celebrate and share the blessings our Lord has bestowed upon us.

Stewardship is the means to accomplish this. It is an honor to be able to serve the Lord at St. Demetrios. Give your time, talent, and treasury freely and lovingly. Please consider that the most important and transformational family events in our lives - Weddings, Baptisms, and Funerals - are celebrated at church. The rewards are great. It is with much pleasure and appreciation to report that, with the continuous support of its members and members of the St. Demetrios community, the Philoptochos was able to meet our yearly commitments/donations to both the National and Metropolis Philoptochos Societies.

We also provided disaster relief funds toward Turkey & Syria that were rocked by deadly earthquakes, to Maui that was devastated by disastrous wildfires, as well as toward the floods and fires that consumed so many areas of Greece.

Furthermore, we recently held a coat drive and provided a local charity with about 20 coats, gloves, scarves, and hats. Our annual Thanksgiving food collection allowed us to donate two carloads of non-perishable food items to the Salvation Army and St. Vincent de Paul food pantries.

How wonderful it is that we were able to do all this for so many people in need of our assistance!

In addition to our regular yearly activities, the Philoptochos held a Mezedakia Night, sponsored a trip to Agia Skepi for members of the community, and a Christmas Pot-Luck Luncheon will be held for its members and their families.
