## From Father Nick's Desk

#### St. Demetrios, Warrior for Jesus.

St. Demetrios is often described as "Warrior for Jesus". He received this title because he exhibited the same dedication and service to Jesus as he did as a general in the Roman army. He is one of the most revered military saints in the Orthodox Christian world, often depicted in military attire and paired with Saint George.

According to tradition, Demetrios was born to a noble Christian family in Thessaloniki, Greece, in the 3rd century. His father was a Proconsul for Rome, a very high military position in government. As a military man, he prepared his son, Demetrios, for a military career. Demetrios rose through the ranks, becoming a general. He used his high position as a vehicle for teaching and preaching his Christian beliefs to those under his leadership. Many pagan soldiers became Christians because of his character and his love for Jesus.

When the Emperor Galerius learned that Demetrios was a Christian, he had him imprisoned in a bathhouse next to the gladiatorial arena. While in prison, Demetrios gave his blessing to his disciple, Nestor, who was about to fight the powerful pagan gladiator Lyaeus in the arena. With Demetrios' encouragement, Nestor defeated and killed Lyaeus, enraging the emperor. In retaliation, Galerius ordered both men executed. Nestor was beheaded and Demetrios was martyred by being stabbed with spears in his prison cell. It is reported that Demetrios, knowing that they were coming to spear him, raised his right arm above his head so that they would spear him in the same area of his body as the centurion had pierced Jesus on the Cross. By this act he was preaching Jesus right up to the moment of his martyrdom.

After his death, his body was secretly buried by Christians in Thessaloniki. Centuries later, his relics began to exude a sweet-smelling oil, and many miracles of healing have been attributed to this myrrh. This is why he is known as the "Myrrh-Streamer" (or Myroblyte). This fragrant, healing myrrh miraculously flows from his tomb. As more and more of the faithful came to the site of his grave, a basilica was commissioned to be built over the site of his martyrdom.

We are blessed to have this "Warrior for Jesus" as the patron Saint of our parish and we ask him to carry our prayers to our Lord Jesus and to intercede for all our requests.

Let us pray the hymn of his feast.

"The world has found in you a great champion in time of peril, as you emerged the victor in routing the barbarians. For as you brought to naught the boasts of Lyaeus, imparting courage to Nestor in the stadium, in like manner, holy one, great Martyr Demetrios, invoke Christ God for us, that He may grant us His great mercy."


The next special event that is hosted by the PTO will be






## Blessing of our Youth Ministries
